“My Story” by Darren Baker, HOD Program Graduate & HOD Band Member



My name is Darren Baker, 48 years old, from Houston, Texas. My life has been a series of bottoms, full of pain and misery. My mother used to call me a "Stupid, no good, nothing" and my Father used to beat me and laughed while he did it. My grades were horrifying due to learning disabilities. Feelings of inadequacy coupled with extreme physical and psychological abuse pushed me into the drug world to find relief. For 33 years, I battled addiction. I battled with heroin and cocaine for over two decades. My addiction left me homeless in ten different states and in Tijuana for a night. I cannot count how many times I have been in rehabs or how many times I have been in jail or mental hospitals. I've been to prison once. I can't count how many times I have woke up in hospitals from overdoses. My life has been very rough and the pain has been very real, but my life's past mistakes have been lived out for a specific purpose much greater than the sum of those failures. I met the Lord back in 1989 and my life hasn't been the same. Since then, I have been in and out of God's will. Kind of like the prodigal son times 1000. Yet, every time I went back, I gained valuable lessons

that could only be learned by experience. The experiences of losing my way many times over has been invaluable. People may ask, "What's different this time"? Today, I know He is the vine and I am a branch. Apart from Him, I can do nothing. Today, I cling to Christ as if my life depends upon Him. I will quickly lose my way if I do not discipline myself to stay "in Christ". This is a truth that I previously knew, but never took seriously enough. Today, I have everything going for me. I am a H.O.D. graduate. I am a H.O.D. staff member. I work for the Gifts of Grace Resale Store. I sing, teach and disciple men in prison with the H.O.D. band and the H.O.D. prison program. I lead worship at First Baptist Church—Special Friends Ministry. I have everything I need today. But, the most important thing that God has done for me besides restoring my relationship with Himself and my immediate family is, He put me into a new family of men and women that truly care about me. I'm talking about everybody in the H.O.D. Ministry: from my boss and friend, the Executive Director, Tim Wiseman; to the newest member of our recovery program. To all of you and to all of our donors who make this ministry come alive, I give you my appreciation. I am truly blessed. May the Lord bless you more!

HOD Band Update

In June, the HOD Band ministered at the East Texas Treatment Facility in Henderson, Texas to 95 female offenders, followed by 198 male offenders with 60 responding to the altar call. In July, we ministered at Lanes Chapel United Methodist Church in Tyler, Texas with 298 in attendance, and New Life Church in Henderson, Texas with 162 in attendance and 7 responded to the altar call.
